English - To begin with, Year 3 will be exploring the poem the Pied Piper of Hamelin. Next, the children will produce a persuasive advert based on our trip to the British Motor Museum. The following unit will be centred around our text driver 'The Boy Who Biked the World,' where the children will produce a narrative consolidating all their previous year 3 knowledge and understanding.

Maths - Year 3 will continue to use 'Maths Mastery' in order to develop children's key understanding of mathematical vocabulary while moving the children through a range of rehearse, embed and deepen questions. This term's focus for reasoning will be Angles and Shape and Measures. The children will continue to develop their arithmetic skills during MOT lessons.

Text Driver -

The Boy Who Biked the World by Alistair Humphreys

P.E. - The children will build on their skills of coordination and accuracy through weekly sessions on 'Tennis'.

Art - This unit focuses on teaching pupils how to transform 2D card shapes into three-dimensional structures and sculptures. Pupils explore abstract shapes and space, develop skills in constructing 3D objects, and understand the difference between 2D and 3D art.

Year 3 - Geography Summer 2 2025

Settlements

During this unit the children will be studying the local area through fieldwork. They will read and follow maps using four-figure compass points and co-ordinates. We will focus on map skills, locating major cities, identifying human and physical features, describing and understanding types of settlements and land use and using standard symbols and keys.

Science - In this unit, the children will be revisiting key learning from Year 3 by exploring the relationship between hand span and grip strength through scientific enquiry.

Foreign Languages -

This unit focuses on 'Journey around Latin America'. Children will continue to develop their understanding of spoken Spanish whilst using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structure.

PSHE - The children will continue to develop their understanding of themselves and the world around them as part of our Jigsaw unit 'Changing Me'. They will understand that, in animals and humans, lots of changes happen between conception and growing up. They will look at how babies grow and develop inside a mother's uterus and what a baby needs to live and grow.

Computing - Video Trailers

The children will be learning how to use iPads to film and edit a trailer.

R.E - We will learn about our focus religion "Sikhism" and explore how sharing in the Langar reflects equality and it is an important part of society.

Music - The term's focus is 'Traditional Instruments and Improvisation', focusing on Indian music. It is explored through the key threads: Listening and appraising, games, singing, playing instruments, improvising, composing and performing.
