Music - In Music, we will be learning about music associated with the Holi Festival, investigating how colour and imagery can be represented by music.

PSHE - We will develop our awareness of being healthy, looking further into the affects of banned substances and how to maintain a healthy diet.

Maths - During Spring 2, children will be continuing work on fractions and decimals. In addition to this, they will be learning about angles including drawing and measuring with a protractor. In our MOT lessons, children will be rounding numbers, looking at multiples and factors and long division/multiplication.

Geography - Why do oceans matter?

In Spring 2, we will be focusing on learning about the importance of the ocean, how we impact it, as well as how the Great Barrier Reef is affected by pollution.

PE - During our PE lessons, we will be developing our tennis and swimming skills. We will be building skills, confidence, teamwork and basic tactics through control and competitive play. Swimming is scheduled to begin in March.

Foreign Language - We will focus on the unit food and drink. We will learn to express likes and dislikes about food, ask and answer questions about preferences.

Science - For Science, our focus will be biology, where we will be looking at life cycles and reproduction. We will be investigating life cycles in animals and plants, as well as how they reproduce.

Computing - We will be programming, using Micro:Bit to execute programs we have made.

Art - We will be drawing our inspiration from Cai Guo-Qiang, creating interactive 3D art installations.

RE - Throughout Spring 2, Year 5 will be learning about Christianity and their beliefs.
